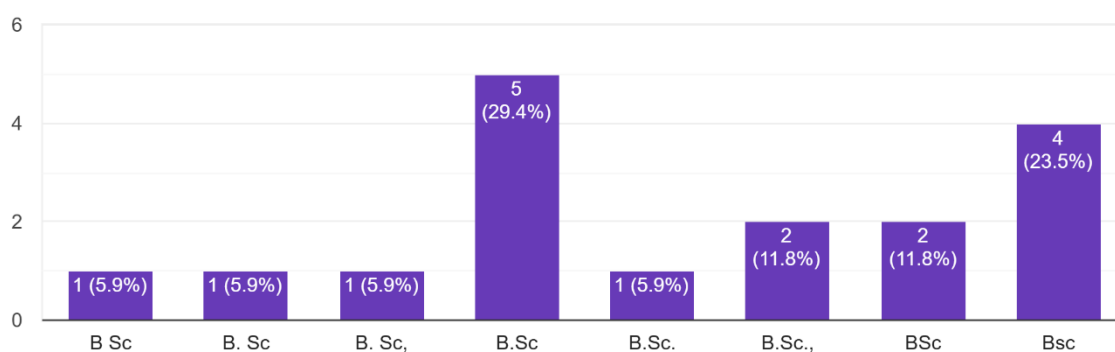

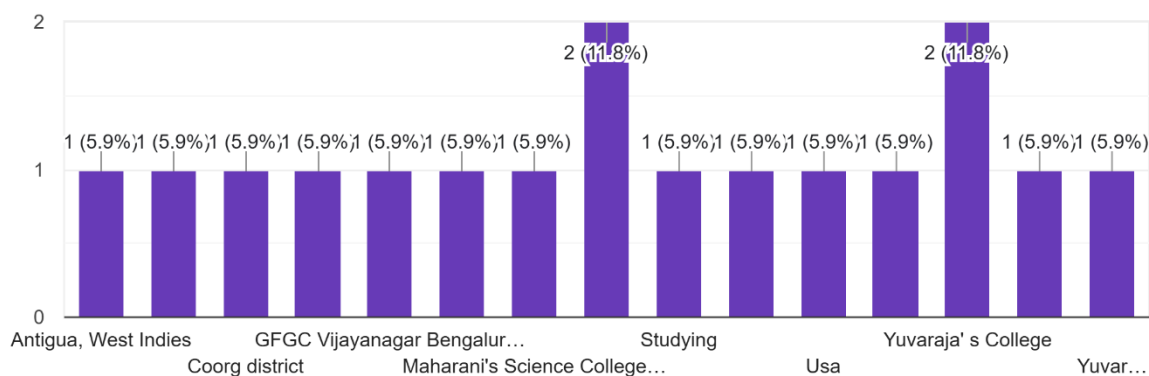

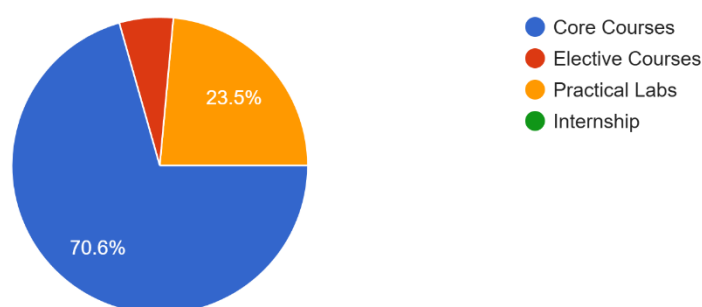

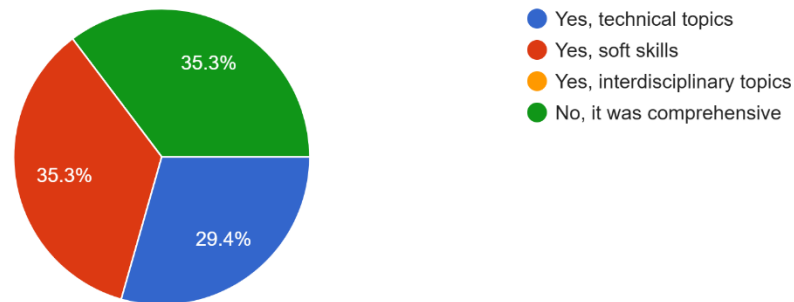

Were there any courses or topics that you felt were missing or underrepresented in the curriculum?

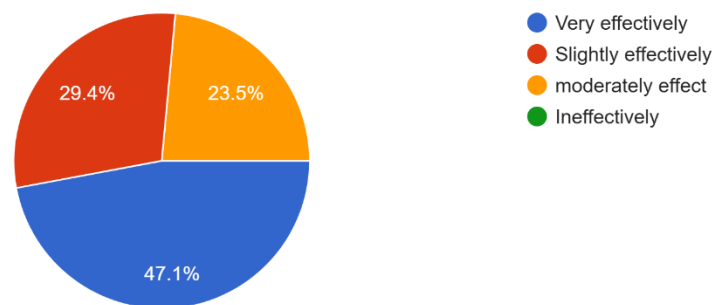

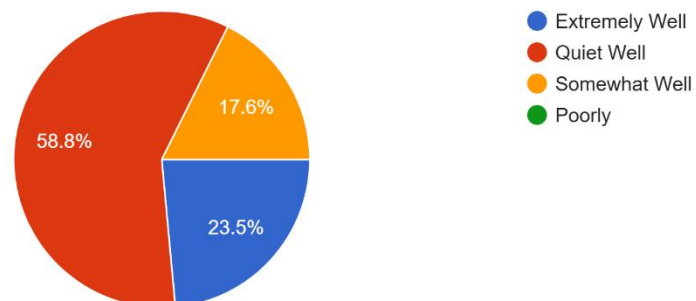

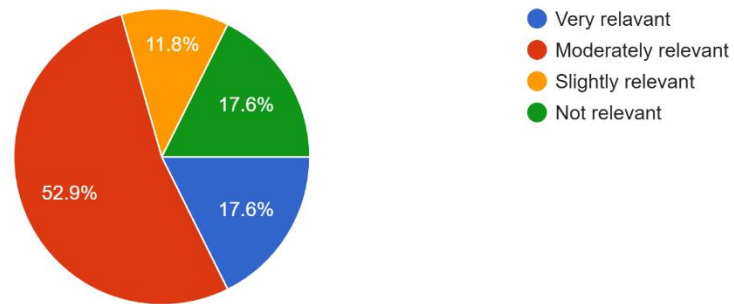

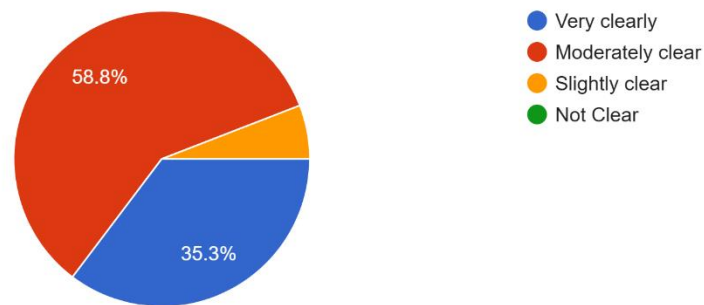

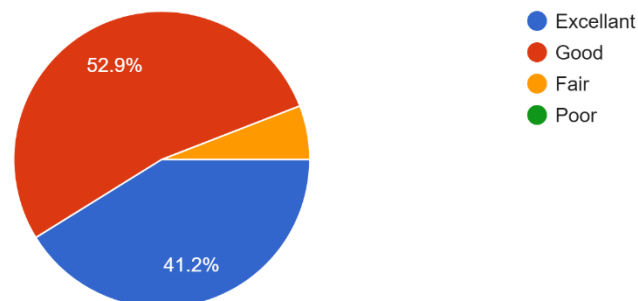

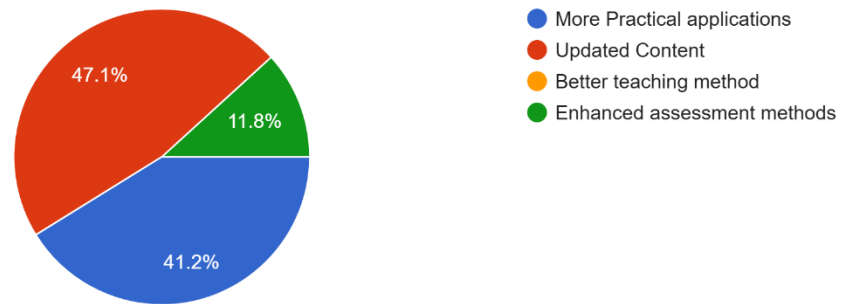

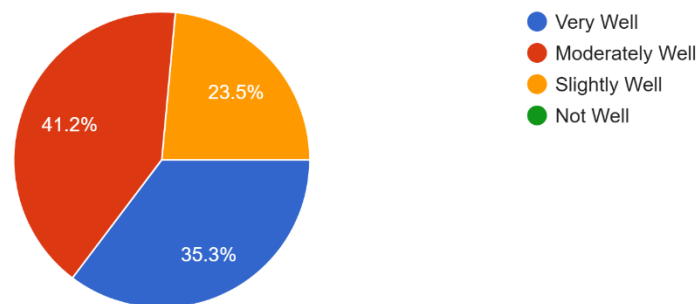
