Yureka Science fest: Yureka Science fest is being organized every year during the even semester. This fest mainly focuses on propagation of Science, along with art and literary events. Every year students come up with innovative ideas to make YUREKA a huge success amongst the student fraternity attracting more than 2500 students from in and around Mysore. This fest brings to the fore the organizational skills among the students and instills in them a feeling of togetherness and camaraderie which is very important to have a positive orientation in life. 3. Orientation Programme : In the beginning of every academic year, the college under aegis of IQAC and the Career Guidance and Placement Cell , organises a twoday Orientation Programme to welcome the new entrants to our college. The new students are made aware about all the rules and regulation, dos and donts and also they are made familiar with the rich legacy of the college. They are informed about the curriculum and the examination procedure. One of the best practices of our college is to organize a workshop on Gender Sensitization during the twoday orientation programme. 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girl students. The awareness program helped to understand that menstruation is a normal biological process, the facts related to the menstrual cycle and managing it with dignity, without discomfort.
